Student leadership camp



Roadshow



Primary students had lots of fun learning about Textiles, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Art, STEM and Agriculture. One primary principal's feedback was-"we LOVE working with your college. Year 7 Green English students are undertaking a design thinking process to transform their written work into film using the WeVideo platform. As part of the process, they were visited by Mr van den Berg (STEM Project Officer), who gave them a fun challenge to complete using the STEM Design Thinking Process that they can now apply to their film project.



Industry Partnerships

Staff from The Rivers Secondary College met with Nathan Kempshall from the Department of Primary Industries, to discuss our partnership in developing resources for excursions to their site. This is a great opportunity for our students to see science in action and to gain insights into a broad range of career options. As part of this process, staff will embed the Design Thinking Process into units of work that will incorporate excursions that make use of not only the physical resources at DPI Wollongbar, but also the experts working in various fields of Science, Agriculture and Sustainability.





The Academy for Enterprising Girls

The Young Change Agents have delivered the Academy for Enterprising Girls to students at Lismore High and Kadina High Campuses. Students followed the Design Process to identify a problem, develop a Social Enterprise solution, then pitch their solution to the group. This program develops key skills in entrepreneurship such as communication, collaboration, critical thinking and problem solving. These are all skills that are essential for success in the modern world. Two teams from each campus have been selected to participate at the next level, which is a two-day incubator hub at Southern Cross University in which they can further develop and pitch their ideas.



On the 7 and 8 December, students from The Rivers Secondary College attended Southern Cross University to attend the Incubator Hub as part of the Enterprising Girls Academy. These students were from the teams that successfully progressed from the one-day in-school programs that were run earlier in the term. Throughout this 2-day program, the students participated in master classes on the Entrepreneurship Journey, Prototyping and Branding, Logo & Design.

Each team was partnered with an industry expert who mentored them through the process of developing their ideas, performing market research and prototyping their product.

These students have left the program in a position to pursue their social enterprise and make it a reality or to take the key skills they have developed into their future endeavours.









Water Quality at Richmond River High

Students in Year 7 at Richmond River High Campus observed catchment management issues through presentations from Dorroughby Environmental Education Centre, using the Rous County Council catchment trailer. This is part of a larger Geography unit in which students have to solve a local issue related to water quality or flood mitigation. We have received great support from staff at Lismore City Council, Rous County Council, Southern Cross University and Dorroughby Environmental Centre.



STEM in the Primary Space

RASE primary schools have had a lot going on in the STEM space. All academy primary schools are embedding technology across all areas of the curriculum. Some highlights of this term include;

- a visit to Lismore Heights Public from Ruth Huwer, Entomologist at the Department of Primary Industries to talk about her job and the importance of insects
- entries from a number of schools in the Green Innovation Awards, resulting in a team from Lismore Heights
 Public School making the finals and receiving a mention at state parliament, and two teams from Dunoon Public
 School making the finals. The results will be announced shortly
